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Class Preparation Checklist:

- ✓ The instructors have provided the supply lists and class-prep instructions on the website.
- ✓ If you have any questions about the class, do not hesitate to contact the instructor. The instructor contact information list was included in the registration packet and is available on the website.
- ✓ There also may be additional pattern or kit fees for your class. These are indicated in the class descriptions. Please be prepared to pay the teacher at the workshop.
- ✓ Please note the type of technique used in your classes and bring **ALL** the following general supplies to each class. This information was included in the registration packet and is available on the website.
- ✓ If you will be using a machine that is new to you, please familiarize yourself with how to use it before class! Make sure you know how to thread it and how to sew an accurate ¼" seam!
- ✓ Remember to bring your flashlights because the lighting is not good between the buildings. And umbrellas in case of rain! And a **surge protection power cord** – this is *essential* if you have a computerized sewing machine!!

Important information and General Supply Lists

Please note the type of technique used in your classes and bring **ALL** the following general supplies to each class:

Basic Sewing Supplies for ALL classes:

- Scissors
- Thread snips
- Seam Ripper (which no one ever needs, of course!)
- Pins

Also good to have but not required:

- Extra lighting
- Chair pad or cushion
- Thread and scrap catcher
- Plastic table cover

Hand Class General Supplies:

- Assorted hand needles in lengths to your personal preference (not ballpoint or embroidery!) Suggestion; size 8, sharp
- Thread, off-white, dark or medium thread
- Thimble, size and type to your personal preference; your favorite hoop, if embroidering

Machine Class General Supplies:

- Sewing machine, in good working order, freshly cleaned and oiled. *If this machine is new to you, **please** familiarize yourself with how to use it before class! While our teachers are experts in their fields, they do NOT know how to thread every machine on the planet!*
- The power cord, and foot pedal plus the instruction manual to your sewing machine
- an extension table for your machine, if available
- sewing machine thread in several neutral colors (beige, gray)
- extra bobbins, pre-loaded with a neutral thread
- machine needles; sizes and types may be indicated in class description
- a ¼" piecing foot, if piecing
- a walking foot and a darning foot, if quilting
- an open-toed appliqué foot, if machine appliquéing
- An extension cord and/or a multi-outlet power strip
- if you have a computerized sewing machine, please bring a **GFI surge protection power strip**; these are available at most office supply stores

Rotary Equipment:

- rotary cutter with **new** blade
- mat - size may be indicated in class description
- rulers - sizes may be indicated in class description

Ironing Equipment:

- **IRONS:** For most classes, a small travel iron works well. Not every student will be able to turn on their irons. The electrical systems in the classrooms cannot handle the power surges. Please be respectful of your fellow students and be willing to share!
- **IRONING SURFACE:** With using the high heat on the iron, it is important that you also bring an appropriate surface to iron on. The heavy-duty padded ironing boards/rectangles that are meant for a table work great, such as Steady Betty Designer Pressing Surfaces. These are available from Nancy's Notions in several sizes. A soft ironing blanket is insufficient. The full-size ironing board will take up too much space, so please see bring a surface that will fit on and protect the work table. This must protect the table surface thoroughly and completely. You will be personally responsible for any damage incurred to property of Cedar Lakes Conference Center.

Additional sewing machine or ironing tables:

- As you set up for a new class – whether on Sunday or Tuesday evening or Wednesday morning, please refrain from setting up any additional tables for your sewing machine or ironing equipment. Check with the instructor for permission and directions as to placement.
- Space is at a premium in every classroom. Please respect the space requirements of all the students.
- *And remember, two campers per table, please!!*
